

DTAS Awareness Course

The transport of raw milk and milk fractions is the essential link between the farmer and the milk processor. The standards applied throughout this part of the dairy supply chain are vital to ensuring food safety, product integrity and maintaining quality. DTAS was developed by the dairy industry to establish uniform and robust standards that would stand up to both internal and external scrutiny, and to therefore demonstrate the highest of standards, which have now been recognised by Red Tractor. In order to permit any dairy product to carry the Red Tractor brand logo, the transport of all raw milk and milk fraction supplies must now be undertaken by a DTAS certified milk haulage operation.

In order to ensure that your business can stand up to the rigorous scrutiny required and demonstrate compliance with the DTAS Standards, all Managers and Supervisors involved need to have a good and effective understanding of the DTAS Standards and how they need to be applied within your operation. This course has been developed as an optional service to provide such awareness and understanding, and has been officially recognised by the DTAS Management Committee. Furthermore it has been developed, and will be delivered independently, by a current DTAS Assessor Trainer.
