


Number of non-conformances per depot 2015/16

ABOUT DTAS

The Dairy Transport Assurance Scheme (DTAS) provides assurance to milk purchasers that the transport of raw milk and milk fractions by hauliers meets food safety requirements, recognised industry good practice and specific customer needs.

The scheme is based on annual inspections of the milk haulage depots operated by scheme members and the assessment is conducted against a range of standards covering fleet and equipment; milk quality, hygiene and security, outbased reload sites; personnel and training; and general management.

In 2015, it became a requirement that all dairy products carrying the Red Tractor logo have to use milk hauled by a DTAS approved haulier.

DTAS is administered by Dairy UK and overseen by a Management Committee drawn from the major milk purchasers and hauliers in the UK as well as a representative from Red Tractor.

Membership of the scheme covers over 90% of milk haulage capacity in the UK.

IMPLEMENTATION

ANNUAL DEPOT ASSESSMENTS

Annual depot assessments are carried out by DTAS certified assessors and organised in conjunction with the milk purchaser and the haulage company with an additional halfyearly internal self-assessment for all hauliers. Depots fully compliant with the standards are awarded a certificate by Dairy UK via the assessor.

TRAINING

DTAS offers two-day assessor training courses including classroom training, a practice assessment and a final exam. An initial assessment must be successfully completed within three months of the exam, shadowed by a registered DTAS assessor. In order to retain their status, assessors must attend a training event either once a year or every two years depending on the number of audits undertaken per year.

RANDOM AUDITS

In addition to the scheduled audits, a maximum of four random audits by independent assessors are authorised throughout the year to ensure consistent application of the standards.

SHADOW AUDITS

Companies employing more than one active assessor must ensure that each one undertakes at least one shadow assessment with another assessor during the course of a year.

AWARENESS COURSE

DTAS offers an Awareness Course to haulage and processing companies to improve their knowledge of the scheme.

BENEFITS

INDUSTRY BENEFITS

The average number of non-compliances per depot has decreased by 13% to only 3.3%, demonstrating the orgoing improvement in the hygiene/safety of their depots and transport fleet.

Alongside the Red Tractor Assurance Dairy Scheme for on farm production, and the British Retail Consortium standards for food processing, the DTAS scheme completes the proposition behind the Red Tractor Logo of farm to fork assurance of the dairy supply chain. This collaboration gives consumers even more reasons to trust the Red Tractor when buying dairy products.

MEMBERS' BENEFITS

According to DTAS standards, hauliers must have a documented Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP) in place that fully covers all aspects of milk collection and delivery. DTAS members have access to the Dairy UK HACCP to comply with these standards as long as the haulage depot is involved in the annual review process.

At the DTAS Annual Conference, members and assessors receive essential information on changes proposed by the Standards Working Group, new members, the HACCP review, forthcoming training, scheme statistics, non-compliance data and more.

DTAS certified hauliers have access to communication and promotion material to increase their visibility and showcase their scheme membership.

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DAIRY UK ANNUAL REPORT



DAIRY TRANSPORT ASSURANCE SCHEME

The Dairy Transport Assurance Scheme provides assurance to milk purchasers that the transport of raw milk meets food safety requirements, recognised industry good practice and specific customer needs.

The scheme is based on annual inspections of the mik haulage depots operated by scheme members. The assessment is conducted against 59 standards covering haulage operations, which hygions, site and statutory requirements, HACCP, personnel and training, subcontractors and contingency procedures.

The scheme is administered by Dairy UK and is overseen by a Management Committee drawn from major milk purchasers in the UK: Membership of the scheme covers an estimated 80% to 90% of milk haulage capacity in the

Alongside the Red Tractor Assurance Dainy Scheme and the British Retail Consortium standards, the DTAS scheme completes the farm to fork assurance of dairy production, processing and distribution.

DTAS membership increased by 40% in 2016, now covering 49 members, 82 depots and 10 associate members.

The average number of noncompliances per depot (items for which they fail to comply with the Scheme Standards) decreased by 13% to only 3.3%, demonstrating the orgoing improvement in the hygiena/salety of their depots and transport fleet. New self-adhesive stickers are now available for scheme members, with large stickers for use on rear domes and smaller onles for cab doors. These can be used by members to promote awareness of the DTASI scheme and recognise members' efforts to comply with stingent standards.

A DTAS Awareness Course was launched in the autymn for dary professionals wishing to gain a throrough understanding of DTAS Standards, without becoming assessmers. The course aims to get managers, supervisions and new parsonnel of hauliars and milk purchasers involved to improve their knowledge of the standards and their application within their organization. It covers al DTAS Standards, focusing on compliance orgunements and practical elements. Courses can be arranged for individual businesses and can be tailored to spoofic needs.

An additional training course was developed for prospective assessors.

A number of annual Continuing Professional Development days took piace throughout the year, focusing on food safety, legislation, food hygiene and standards as well as a practical session on inspecting mulk tankers and cleaning in place (CIP). All auditors who undertake two or more audits a year are required to attend CPD training annually.

DTAS Awareness Course held on 22nd March at SJ Bargh Ltd Lancaster

A DTAS Awareness Course was held on Wednesday, 22nd March.

The one-day course was delivered by Charlton Agricultural Solutions and covered all the DTAS Standards as well as includeing a practical element.

The objective of the course is to focus on what is required to comply with the DTAS Standards and it is tailored towards someone who wishes to gain a thorough understanding of the DTAS Standards, and how they relate to their business, without necessarily wishing to train as a DTAS assessor.

Further courses wiill be announced shortly.

DTAS Awareness Course

DTAS already runs training courses for those people who wish to become qualified as assessors under the DTAS Scheme.

We have also received a number of enquiries from people who wish to gain a good and effective understanding of the DTAS Standards, but do not wish to become assessors.

In response, a DTAS Awareness Course has been developed for Managers, Supervisors and new personnel of hauliers and milk purchasers to improve their knowledge of the Standards, and how they need to be applied within their organisation. It covers all the DTAS Standards, focusing on what is required to comply with them, and also includes practical elements.

Courses can either be arranged for an individual business, and could be tailored to specific needs, or may be arranged to meet demand within a locality for a number of businesses or interested parties.
